Create a beautiful mosaic (whilst learning your times tables)!! (See **Easter themed mosaics** below.)

Also, try these lower KS2 **Easter challenge cards** (see below). There is also a harder set of challenge cards (see below) which may involve you using your formal written methods. No need to print - just read them off of the screen. The answers are on the final card, so try not to look until you've finished answering them all!!

## Poetry inspiration!
