






5-10 minutes activities spread throughout the day are better than longer activities.

Draw your own farmyard.

You will need:

- Paper and pens
- A dice (spotty or numbered)

1. Draw a simple farmyard with fields and pens ready for your child to add the animals. (You could use large paper for this or even chalk it on the floor outside.)
2. Ask your child to think of a farm animal e.g. pig.
3. Roll the dice and draw that many pigs on the farm.
4. Repeat steps 1 and 2 until you have a farmyard picture full of animals.

Hints/tips

- Does your child recognise the amount of spots without having to count them e.g your child might know it has landed on 2 without having to count the spots because they recognise the pattern of 2.
- Can your child count the spots accurately using 1:1 counting e.g. says one number name as they point to each spot.
- If you are using a numbered dice can they recognise the numbers without any help?
- Is your child able to draw the correct number of animals? Can they stop at the correct number without being prompted? Can they keep track of the amount when drawing the animals?
