Challenge 4

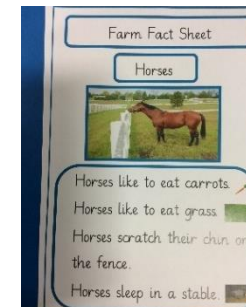
Literacy

The Oak National Academy online teaching site is looking at the story of the Three Little Pigs and I thought this would fit really nicely with our topic. Have a look at the lessons via the link. (You do not need to complete the phonics activities so fast forward that bit!) You will need a "talking partner teddy!" (Short clips and activities to work through all week i.e listen to the story Monday, create a story map the next day etc...)

And/or you could create a **Farm Animal Fact Sheet**

Choose your favourite farm animal. Draw or paint it and then see what facts you can find out about it. Remember to write in sentences using finger spaces and full stops. Encourage the children to have a go at sounding out unfamiliar words. At this stage we would encourage children to have a go at writing the words phonetically - so it doesn't matter about spelling mistakes. It is good to see what sounds they can actually hear in the words. Lines for writing on are helpful too!



Independent Activities

Physical Development

Practise those scissors skills - find an old magazine and cut out some pictures to make a collage or give a toilet roll a haircut!



Get moving! Ideally get out into the garden/outdoor space for this one. Set a timer for 30 seconds and count how many of the following you can do before the timer runs out.

- Star jumps
- Hopping on the spot
- Skipping with a skipping rope
- Tuck jumps

Chalk your score on the floor or write it down on paper. Challenge your grown-up or sibling to beat your scores.

Exploring Media and Materials

Raid the recycling - build a farm!

Have a look through the recycling and make a model using boxes, tubes and tubs etc. Think carefully about your design, draw up a plan before you start. Think about what you will need to attach things together etc and make a list. Then get creating. Once finished decorate your model and make it look wonderful!

Tricky word Bingo

Help your child to make some tricky word cards (Phase 2 and 3, once your child is confident with phase 2 & 3 move onto Phase 4)

- Put the word cards into a bag/pillowcase/Tupperware tub.
- All players must write down 3 tricky words on their piece of paper.
- The bingo caller selects a tricky word card one at a time from the bag.
- The winner will be the first person to tick off all their tricky words and shouts BINGO.

* remember we call them tricky words because they cannot be sounded out in the usual way, we must learn to read and write them by sight!

Tricky Words:

Phase 2 the, to, I, no, go, into

Phase 3 he, she, we, me, be, was, you, they, all, are, my, her

Phase 4 said, have, like, so, do, some, come, were, there, little, one, when, out, what
