

5-10 minutes activities spread throughout the day are better than longer activities.

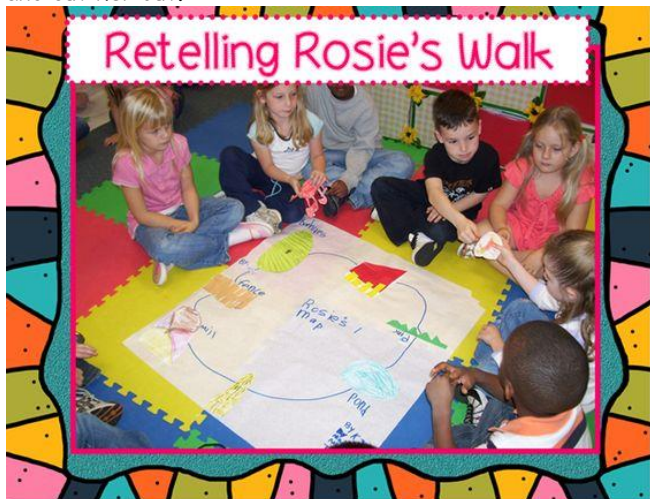
Challenge 1

Communication and Language - Chicken eggs

Do you like eggs? Put a raw egg carefully in a bag with a seal. You can now look really carefully at the inside of an egg. Is it all the same colour? If you have a magnifying glass look through it. You can hold the egg very gently, what does it feel like? Hold it up against a window, can you see through? When you are finished talking then cook some scrambled egg.

We are going to learn about milk. This cbeebies video shows how the milk goes from cow to shops.

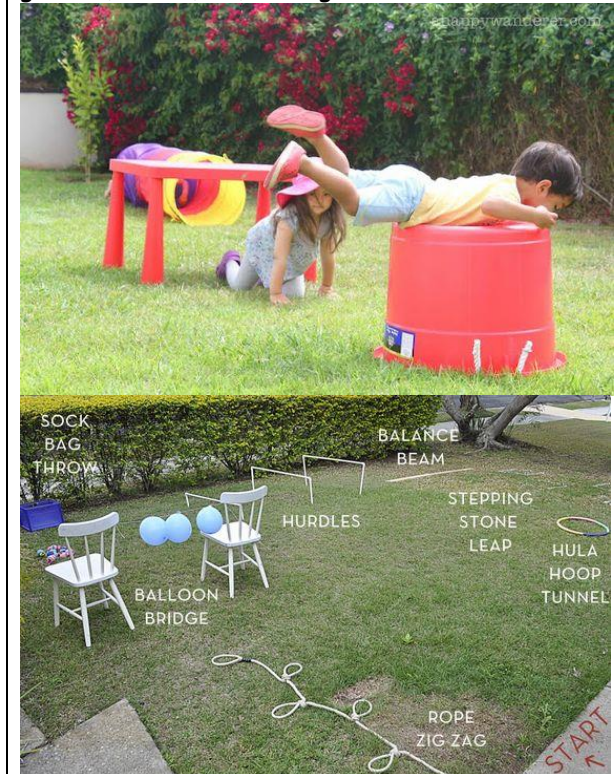

Make your own walking obstacle course. What can you go over, under, on, through and around?



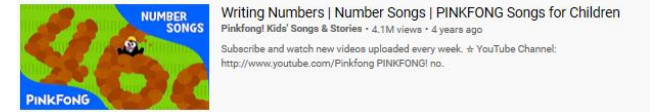

Maths Challenges for this week Number Formation

Have fun practicing forming numbers. Writing numbers song by PINKONG on YouTube is great for helping children to form numbers accurately. Encourage your children to write the number in the air along with the video.

Below are some fun ways to practice writing numbers. Give them a go.



Number Hunt

When out on your daily walk see how many numbers you can find. You could take a clipboard and write them as you find them.

Create a number hunt for your child around the house or in the garden. Make individual number cards with your child by writing the number on pieces of card or paper. You might want to start with numbers to 5 then move onto numbers to 10. Hide them around the house or garden for your child to find.

Sorting

Sorting and classifying objects helps children begin to notice how items are alike and different, and creates an awareness that is vital for maths learning. Try a few of these quick and easy sorting activities.

- After a trip to the supermarket, have your child sort the food according to where it is stored: freezer foods, fridge foods, cupboard foods and other household items.
- Sock sort! The dreaded task of sorting socks is just a big math game for young children. Have your child help you sort the socks by size or family member and then by colour.

- Tidy up time provides wonderful opportunities to practice sorting. The simple task of putting the blocks in one container and the crayons in another is actually an early lesson in sorting and classifying.
- While playing with the cars, notice similarities in several cars. Lay out a few pieces of coloured paper and ask your child to drive the cars onto the "carpark" paper that matches the car colour. Cars can also be sorted by types: trucks, race cars, motorcycles, and emergency vehicles.
- Sort wooden blocks or beads by size,
