<u>Predatory Birds</u>

We learnt a bit about predatory birds before school closed but this week I would like you to find out a bit more...

Watch video and documentary footage of different predatory birds catching and eating their



prey. Think about why predators must kill and eat other animals and predict (educated guess) what would happen to them if food became scarce and they struggled to find any.

Make a food chain to show the prey and predator relationships for a chosen bird of prey.

Note: Birds of prey often hunt small animals, such as fish, pigeons and rabbits. They are carnivores and need the flesh of the animals they kill to survive. Some, such as vultures, will scavenge and eat carcasses of animals killed by other predators.




