The Paralympic Games happen after the Olympic Games and are where sportsmen and women who have a disability compete.

Rio 2016 Olympic Games

The Olympic torch was lit in Olympia in Greece. The torch relay began on 21st April and will end on 5th August in Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, where the Olympics will be held. The opening and closing ceremonies will take place on 5th and 21st August 2016.

During the Olympic Games teams from 200 different countries will compete and more than 10,000 athletes will take part in the first round of the 2016 Olympic Games.

There will be 136 sets of medals for women, 161 for men and 9 mixed medals.

Rio de Janeiro is the second largest city in Brazil.

Each Olympic Games takes place in a different city across the world. This year, the Olympics are being held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The torch relay began on 21st April and will end on 5th August. The opening ceremony will take place on 5th August 2016 and the closing ceremony on 21st August 2016.

During the Olympic Games, teams from 200 countries will compete with more than 10,000 athletes competing in the first round of the 2016 Olympic Games. The qualifying events began in 2014 and the official list of athletes will be available shortly before the Games begin. There will be 136 sets of medals for women, 161 for men and 9 mixed medals.

There will be 306 different events in 28 sports over 19 days of competition: aquatics, archery, badminton, basketball, boxing, canoe/kayak, cycling, equestrian, fencing, football, golf, gymnastics, handball, hockey, judo, modern pentathlon, rowing, rugby 7s, sailing, shooting, table tennis, taekwondo, tennis, track and field, triathlon, volleyball (indoor and beach), weightlifting and wrestling.

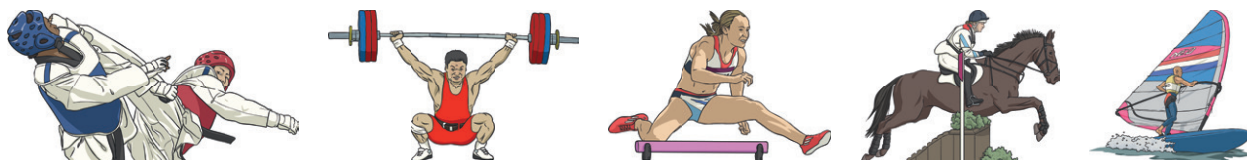

The Olympic Games take place every four years. The Paralympic Games take place after the Olympic Games where sportsmen and women who have a disability meet up and compete. The Olympic Torch is lit in Olympia, Greece as it was during the ancient Olympic Games. The flame travels around Greece and then to the country where the games will be taking place. The symbol of the modern Olympic Games is five interlocking rings which are blue, yellow, black, green and red. The five rings represent the five continents, or parts of the world, which took part in the first modern Olympic Games. Track runners today wear special shoes that have spikes to help them grip. Women and men both take part, but they do not compete against each other. Olympic medals are awarded to athletes that come 1st - gold, 2nd - silver, and 3rd - bronze, in their event.

Rio 2016 Olympic Games

Each Olympic Games takes place in a different city across the world. In 2008, the games took place in Beijing, China and in 2012 the host city was London, England. This year, in 2016, the Olympics are being held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The 2016 Summer Olympics torch relay began on 21st April and will end on 5th August in Rio de Janeiro. The opening ceremony will take place on 5th August 2016 and the closing ceremony will be on 21st August 2016.

During the Olympic Games teams from 200 different countries compete to become Olympic Champions. More than 10,000 athletes will take part in the first round of the 2016 Olympic Games. The qualifying events began in 2014 and the official list of athletes will be available before the Games begin. There will be 136 sets of medals for women, 161 for men and 9 mixed medals.
