

	Go for a walk around Glossop and go on a hunt to find human features. Give your child a copy of the <u>Human features hunt</u> sheet to help them. Explain that they should use the spotting sheet to answer the question 'What human features do we have in our local area?' Encourage the children to take photographs and use the correct vocabulary to name the features they see. For example, church, shop or bridge. Back at home, look at the photographs, talk about the features seen and discuss why they are important to the community.	Watch Go Jetters Series 1: 3.
