According to the Manchester Evening News, stargazers could hope to spot something very interesting in the night sky recently. On Saturday 30th May, the Falcon 9 rocket carrying the Crew Dragon capsule set off from launchpad 39A at the Kennedy Space Centre and headed for the International Space Station.



Strapped inside were experienced NASA astronauts Robert Behnken, 48, and Douglas Hurley, 43 who would be making history as this was the first time astronauts would be launched into orbit from US soil in nine years.

Did any of you know about this? Unfortunately I missed it, but there are other spectacles to be spotted in the night sky later this month.
