<u>Writing</u>

Write about a 'day in the life' of your favourite sea creature or character (real or imaginary). Alternatively, you can write about the monster of the deep you created yesterday!!

What must it be like to swim like a fish or crawl like a crab - can you describe it and do the actions? What about living in a rock pool versus the wider ocean? Would being a mermaid, or a pirate, be fun?

Write a story from the point of view of your favourite sea creature. Go for it, and write (or type if preferred) as much as you can!! Don't forget to edit it afterwards (with an adult/sibling if needed).

Blue Abyss Topic (Science/Art).

Research the magnificent jellyfish on the website National Geographic Kids! What does the word bioluminescent mean? Make your own jellyfish! (Courtesy of Mrs Mettrick ©).

You will need:

- half a sheet of old newspaper
- a scrap piece of card/paper (with an extra small dome shape for the body)
- glue (pritt stick is fine)
- water colours blue/green/red/orange (paint is fine but it has to be well watered down)
- pieces of scrap wool/bubble wrap/sea-through plastic
- 1) Take half a sheet of newspaper. Use water colours if possible, but anything you have at home will be ok. Paint one side dark blue, and the other a red/orange colour.
- 2) Find a piece of paper (preferably card). In school, we turned our card to landscape rather than portrait.
- 3) We then painted wavy blue/green lines to represent the sea.

 Afterwards, we left our painted papers to dry.
- 4) We then cut out a separate piece of card (dome shape) for the body. Once dried, we stuck the newspaper print to the dome as a collage.
- 5) Long pieces of bubble wrap/clear plastic/wool were stuck on the back of the dome (to represent the tentacles). This was then glued on to our dried 'sea' background!
